

ONE YEAR WRAP-UP:

Though in some sense it feels like we just arrived, in another sense Mexico feels like it has always been home. The past 14 months have been a tremendous joy to us, and we'd like to share just two of the lessons the Lord has been teaching us during our first year as missionaries.

- 1) Being missionaries makes us ask ourselves constantly, "Why do we do this... because it's biblical, or because it's American?" The way I love my wife, the way I hold my baby, the way I drive, the way I pray, the way I preach, the way I think... it seems as if every aspect of our lives has been challenged, and we are thankful. Every time we are confronted with a new way of doing things, whether at church or at home, we have to sit down and consider whether we live the way we do because of a cultural preference, or because God commands us to so live. This spiritual discipline has been extremely profitable to us and is something I hope we can grow in wherever the Lord may direct us.
- 2) Being missionaries has rebuked our still meager hunger for God's word, and showed us how desperately we still need Him. It's not enough to have family devotions, we must have private intimacy with God. Yet it's not enough to just have private intimacy, we as a family must seek His face as well. As newly-weds, figuring out how to accomplish this is not always easy. But being a missionary who works out of the home has allowed us the flexibility we need to experiment. We face the failures together... and the victories as well. May we find even more time to read/memorize His Word and pray.
